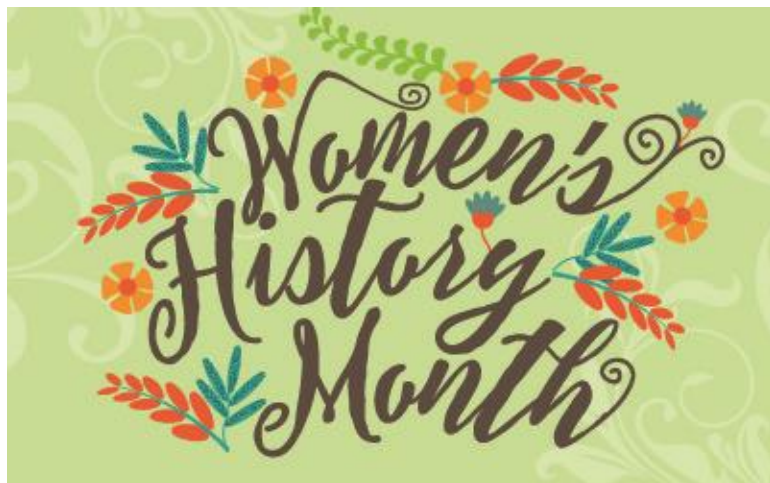

Women's History Month Reception

This March marks the 31st Women's History Month celebration. Thousands of cultural, historic, and philanthropic institutions around the country will celebrate the rich and formidable contributions of women throughout history. On March 9, GFWC will host our annual Women's History Month Reception at Headquarters. Page Harrington, Executive Director of the National Women's Party (NWP), will speak about the illustrious history of the organization, and its current endeavors to educate the public on the women's rights movement.

Founded in 1917, the National Women's Party was host to women advocating for suffrage. The NWP engaged Congress and the country through the organization of nonviolent protests, such as marches, pickets, speaking tours, and hunger strikes. Their determination and grit captured the attention of the nation and garnered public support for the women's suffrage movement. After the passage of the 19th amendment in 1920, Alice Paul, founder of the NWP, knew their work was just beginning. In 1923, Paul wrote the Equal Rights Amendment, which the NWP advocated for throughout the remainder of the 20th century. Today, Page Harrington leads the National

She was a founding member of the Stevens County affiliate and has assumed several leadership positions within the organization. "It has become my second favorite charity, GFWC of course being the first," says President Mumm. Therefore, Habitat for Humanity was the natural choice when selecting the Special Project for her administration.

Founded in 1976, Habitat for Humanity partners with people all over the world to assist them to construct or improve a place they can call home. Habitat homeowners participate in the build alongside volunteers and pay an affordable mortgage. With the support of volunteers like GFWC Minnesota, Habitat homeowners achieve the stability and independence they need to create a better life for themselves and their families. Habitat currently works in 1,400 communities across the U.S. and in over 60 countries, and has helped 6.8 million people.

If you or your club are interested in participating, consider joining a Women Build event. Started in 1991, the Women Build program allows any woman who wishes to help construct a home take part. No experience is necessary. Volunteers work under the guidance of construction professionals, and also alongside other volunteers and future Habitat homeowners.
