
Reasons to Attend the 2017 GFWC Annual Convention

Hacienda Girls Ranch was built through the care and generosity of GFWC Florida clubwomen over more than four decades. Founded in 1968, the Ranch gives teenage girls with nowhere else to turn a place to call home. The girls who live at the Ranch have been removed from their homes due to their families' inability to care for them. Many residents have suffered abuse or neglect.

While ownership of the Ranch was relinquished to the Children's Home Society in 1998, GFWC Florida continues to support the organization. Current GFWC Florida President Mary Powell has selected the Ranch as the Special Project for her administration. President Powell's goal is to meet four key objectives:

- The construction of a fence to protect residents from outside intruders.
- The purchase of necessary home supplies such as comforters, sheets, towels, and curtains as well as decorative items that allow the girls to personalize their rooms.
- Provision of the extra items teenage girls need to fit in with their peers such as prom dresses, homecoming tickets, school pictures, art supplies, and birthday cakes.
- Allowing the girls to participate in activities that promote healthy living, social skills, and positive relationships in the community. For instance, girls may attend summer camp or be given YMCA memberships, sports equipment, or musical instruments.

Although many heartwarming tales could be shared, one particular example of how much the services mean to the girls living at the Ranch is Alyssa's story. Alyssa was about to turn 15 and was told she would be given a birthday party. She did not want any of the usual birthday treats such as a cake or ice cream. However, when told she would receive a gift, Alyssa quickly requested a pair of virtual reality glasses. While most children Alyssa's age would have had 14 other birthday celebrations with lots of presents, this was Alyssa's first birthday party and present.

Hacienda Girls Ranch thrives today thanks to the support of GFWC Florida. President Powell's Special Project continues work toward the state's ultimate aim of creating "a better world for every girl".

Help Raise Awareness of Autism Spectrum Disorders

In 2016, the **GFWC Grundy Woman's Club** (Virginia) launched a very successful campaign to advocate for those with autism and their caregivers by sharing the personal story of clubwoman JoBeth Wampler. In a blog post placed on the club's website, JoBeth shared her reaction upon receiving an autism diagnosis for her son Josh, saying:

... he may never enjoy a baseball game, come home with a frog in his pocket, kiss a girl, or tell us he loved us. It was the hardest time of our lives, as we came to grips with the possibility we may someday wish he'd die before we did. Because, being on the severe side of the spectrum, it's possible he'll never be able to function without our care.

Saturday marks the start of Autism Awareness Month. The clubwomen of Grundy are planning to go even further in their own support of Autism Awareness Month this year. They will hold a 5k race, sell blue light bulbs, sponsor informational sessions at the local YMCA, and continue their social media campaign in an effort to fund a new project. Based on Joshua's experiences and the prevalence of drowning deaths among autistic individuals, the Grundy club will provide free swimming lessons for autistic children.

When the clubwomen of Grundy welcomed JoBeth into their club, they also took on her mission and her concerns. Can there be any greater example of Federation sisterhood?
