More than 30 years ago, California State President Toby Kahan began supporting the [City of Hope National Medical Center](#). Through membership in her neighborhood City of Hope Chapter, she learned of the “wonderful care and treatment they provide patients.” In 2000 when President Kahan’s beloved husband was diagnosed with Leukemia, the family immediately turned to City of Hope for his treatment. Mr. Kahan lost his battle in 2007; however, President Kahan will never forget how well he was looked after or the compassion shown her entire family.

Motivated by personal experiences, President Kahan is encouraging all California clubwomen to promote and financially support City of Hope’s research programs during her administration. As President Kahan says, “Every discovery,

breakthrough, and advancement is powered by donations." The contributions of California clubwomen will undoubtedly be put to good use. City of Hope is staffed by more than 200 researchers, has more than 500 innovative projects in development, and consists of more than 400 facilities in 40 states and 30 countries.

Among the numerous innovations made by City of Hope's doctors and researchers are the development of new cancer medications, treatments that may successfully reverse type 1 diabetes, and blood stem cell transplants to assist HIV/AIDS patients. Individuals around the world will benefit from these discoveries as techniques and research findings are shared.

GFWC California has already donated over \$4,000 in support of City of Hope's research through participation in the City of Hope Walk for Hope last November and through club and member donations. Edith Gifford: Member of the Housekeeper's Club 1904 to 1925

Edith Gifford was a woman of education and culture, stalwart character, and a deep sense of community. Her personal motto was "If a thing needs doing, do it!" Characterizing her commitment, in 1884 Edith leased the town of Wrightsville, Pennsylvania, where tenants lived in squalor. She repaired houses, provided municipal services, established a library and bank, hired a school principal and a visiting physician, and banished roaming pigs from the town's streets. She proved that "enlightened management" can bring financial success as

well as reform. Later in Coconut Grove, she established a Red Cross Chapter and built a Health Clinic to serve the needy and school children. To serve the mind and spirit, Edith delivered scholarly papers on music, history, forestry, and women's suffrage. She produced musical performances where she not only talked about the music, but also played the piano to accompany singers.

As an early and ardent conservationist, Edith, with some "ladies from Philadelphia," organized the Pennsylvania Forestry Association. From 1905-1916 she was a visionary and vital force in the creation of Florida Federation's Royal Palm State Park, which became the nucleus of the Everglades National Park. She titled her final report as park committee chair "A Dream Has Come True." The establishment of a Conservation Department in GFWC and its subsequent efforts to create countless State and National Parks is due to Edith's 1906 Proposal.

Promoting Literacy and Getting Hooked in a Good Book

GFWC Maryland Director of Juniors Clubs Becca Wagman has dedicated her administration to increasing children's literacy rates in the state. The concept was incorporated into GFWC Maryland's Mid-Winter Rally through the "Getting Hooked in a Good Book" service project. The project resulted in the collection of 270 books, creation of [Read Across America](#) tracking charts, development of decorative posters with

inspirational quotes, and reorganization of the Boys & Girls Club of Westminster's library.

The GFWC Junior Woman's Club of Westminster has a longstanding relationship with the local Boys & Girls Club. In the past, clubwomen have taken part in the Boys & Girls Club of America's summer literacy programs, maintained the center, and volunteered to teach the children new skills. The Boys & Girls Club was selected for support due to the unquestionable need of the children participating.

Every day in America, over 15 million children (1 out of 4) are left unsupervised after school. In the summer, 43 million children (3 out of 4) do not have access to critical summer learning programs. Boys & Girls Clubs in almost every U.S. community work to address these concerns.
