Remembering Marijo Shide

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Marijo Shide, GFWC International Past President from 1980-1982, on Monday, May 22, 2017.

Born and raised in Grand Forks, North Dakota, Marijo managed her father's grain-testing laboratory until she married Don Shide, a lawmaker and farmer. The couple settled in Larimore, ND and community improvement became the focus Marijo's active volunteer career — a career that culminated in becoming GFWC's 33rd International President.

President Shide assumed office during a turbulent time in America's history and at a point when volunteers were greatly undervalued. However, she was among the first to answer President Reagan's call for a "rejuvenation of the volunteer spirit" and her term included many impressive accomplishments. From launching a marketing campaign to promote Federation, to oversight of the first GFWC Distinguished Volunteer Awards, to the creation of a national crime prevention program, President Shide's administration not only achieved its many goals but

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made a lasting impact on our organization. As remarked by GFWC International President Sheila Shea, Marijo fulfilled her life-long belief that "Volunteer service is the rent we pay for the privileges we enjoy."

During her term, President Shide traveled extensively in order to visit GFWC international affiliates, to attend the eighth International Congress of Women in Germany, and to participate in the 60th anniversary of the National Federation of Woman's Clubs of the Philippines. When asked about meeting clubwomen from such different cultures President Shide stated, "They spoke different languages, had different levels of education, lived in different economic circumstance, but the interesting thing was that the women were the same...these were givers, not takers. It was an awe-inspiring adventure. And to meet people who are in service to others and to be part of it — I guess I enjoyed everywhere I was and was happy to be there."

At the conclusion of her administration, Marijo returned to Larimore but she did not stop volunteering with either her local club or the many other organizations she supported. President Shide went on to serve six-years on the State Board of Higher Education, to receive the U.S. Air Force Distinguished Public Service Award in 2009, and to accept the Henry Havig Award for Community Service — the highest recognition given to her community's civic society leaders.

A memorial service for President Shide will be held at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 1 at Parkwood Place in Grand Forks, North Dakota. Additional information regarding funeral arrangements and condolences has been posted to [GFWC's website](#).

GFWC Pennsylvania Works to Enrich, Educate, Empower – Every Child, Every Day

For a teacher, school administrator, mother, and grandmother, there can be no higher priority than children. Because GFWC Pennsylvania President Lois Richards has been all four roles, she knows that children must be “enriched, educated, and empowered every day” in order to have a successful future. It is only with proper support from both family and community that children will flourish and become productive, well-adjusted citizens.

President Richard’s goals for her administration’s Special Project include encouraging clubwomen to expand work on their current projects and to develop new programs focusing on children. One project recently completed by Pennsylvania’s clubwomen is the creation of fun gift bags filled with crayons, coloring books, stuffed toys, and other child-friendly items for donation to hospitals and homeless shelters. Pennsylvania clubwomen created 450 care packages during this year’s annual business meeting and state convention. Imagine the 450 smiles these gift packages created when received by 900 little hands!

To generate additional funds for the support of children, GFWC Pennsylvania is selling pins engraved with President Richard’s theme “Every Child, Every Day”. Proceeds from the pins and 50/50 raffles held during each of six fall district meetings have been given to local charities to improve the health and welfare of children in their schools and communities.
