GFWC Attends A Nation United For A Safer Future 2017 Gun Violence and Prevention Summit

This week, GFWC Legislation/Public Policy Chairman Becky Weber and GFWC Signature Program: Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention Chairman Cynthia Geis are in Washington, D.C. to participate in A Nation United For A Safer Future 2017 Gun Violence and Prevention Summit. As stated in the *GFWC Club Manual*, 19% of domestic violence situations involve a weapon and the presence of a gun increases the risk of a homicide occurring by 500%. GFWC is committed to ending domestic violence and supports legislation that would keep guns out of the hands of those convicted of misdemeanor stalking. GFWC also supports prohibiting abusive dating partners from owning firearms. The summit was hosted by Americans for Responsible Solutions and the Brady Campaign, and aims to build a safer future for all Americans. At the summit, Becky and Cynthia learned more about advocating for laws that will protect victims of domestic violence. "The summit focused on gun safety

In 2018, GFWC will sponsor a medical mission with Operation Smile to provide surgeries for children who would otherwise not have access to them. GFWC will also give a few clubwomen the chance to witness this life-changing experience firsthand! Clubs donating \$500 or more to Operation Smile will be entered into a GFWC-sponsored drawing. For each additional \$500, clubs will receive another entry into the drawing. Winning clubs will be able to give one member the opportunity to participate in a self-funded Operation Smile Medical Mission in Central America! GFWC Mississippi President Tinker Forrester has a great love for all things creative and she believes that artistic ability lies within each of us. For these reasons she became involved with the T.K. Martin Center's EXPRESS Yourself! Art program at Mississippi University in 2006, by hosting the program's first art show. She has since continued her support by selecting the EXPRESS Yourself! Art program as the Special Project for her administration. The program provides Mississippi residents with severe physical impairments the opportunity to experience the power of self-expression through art.

Utilizing laser-guided devices and trained volunteers who act “as neutral arms,” physically challenged individuals, most of whom have been diagnosed with cerebral palsy, learn to paint on canvas. A teacher with EXPRESS Yourself! proudly described the program this way, “A person who is unable to hold a paint brush becomes capable of creating subtle, exacting works of art.” The
