"She is a single parent of two amazing young children. She has secured housing, childcare, a job, and transportation for herself and her children. She actively seeks out support services to help with her academic goals. She is a resilient woman, a survivor of intimate partner abuse, who plans on continuing her education with the goal of assisting others who have been in similar situations and are on their own healing journey."

This year, GFWC received over 40 applications for assistance through the GFWC Success for Survivors Scholarship program. Each of the applicants submitted letters of recommendation that contained inspirational and touching descriptions like the one you just read. Due to your generous financial contributions, four of these deserving women received an award of \$2,500 which will aid them in achieving their educational and professional goals.

The scholarship recipients expressed a deep appreciation for the many social workers, first-responders, and medical professionals who helped them overcome abusive circumstances. As a result

of their experiences, each has selected a career path that will not only allow them to support their families, but to improve the lives of others in abusive relationships. The 2017 scholarship awardees include a future nurse, social worker, clinical therapist, and trauma specialist.

Since the scholarship's inception in 2012, GFWC has awarded over \$60,000 to assist those impacted by intimate partner abuse who are pursuing higher education. One recipient recounts her success this way, "After leaving my abusive husband, I have received my GED; was the valedictorian of my community college; and was admitted to a prestigious university. Ongoing therapy has enabled me to use my story as a tool to inspire others....I graduated with honors and accepted my diploma with my head held high."

GFWC clubwomen should take great pride in their continued support of these courageous women.

Stand Up for Our Children's Health

Home visiting programs reduce child abuse, neglect and injury, domestic violence, and crime!

It is time for Congress to reauthorize both the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). Both

GFWC Utah: Supporting a Cause, Inspiring Leaders

According to the International Labor Organization, an estimated 21 million people worldwide are subjected to human trafficking, including an estimated 5.5 million children. "Left unchecked, human trafficking will continue to flourish in environments where traffickers can reap substantial monetary gains with a relatively low-risk of getting caught or losing profits," reports the National Human Trafficking Hotline.

GFWC Utah President Mohea Sprouse was inspired to join the movement to free children trapped in slavery and selected Operation Underground Railroad (O.U.R) as one of the Special Projects for her administration. O.U.R. is a nonprofit organization that leads coordinated rescue efforts of human trafficking victims throughout the world. President Sprouse first heard about O.U.R after attending a screening of their documentary, as well as hearing O.U.R representatives speak at the GFWC Utah State Conference. Sprouse and several other GFWC Utah clubwomen now make monthly contributions to end child sex trafficking. This fall, GFWC Utah will donate all proceeds from their annual fundraiser to O.U.R.

programs provide critical services to children and families, improving their health, educational achievements, and economic stability. Both programs also provide federal support... to help states build effective childhood systems which provide better coordinated care.

Urge Congress to reauthorize the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program for five years with \$800 million annually allowing expansion to more children and families and to reauthorize the Children's Health Insurance Program for another five years.
