GFWC Juniorettes Making Their Mark

Our Juniorettes have started off the club year with some great projects. Last week, the **Naples Juniorettes** (Florida) made fifteen fleece tie blankets for the newborn babies assisted by the Baby Basics program which provides free diapers to low-income families.

Many Juniorette clubs have begun community projects for the holidays. This year, the **Juniorette Club of Chipley** (Florida) developed a project called Little Brown-bag Blessings. The project helps children who don't have sufficient resources at home by providing non-perishable food that can be easily prepared. The food is distributed at the end of the school day before extended breaks when children cannot rely on federal lunch programs.

The **Gulf Shores Juniorettes** (Alabama) participated in the Box of Joy campaign, a charity that sends Christmas gift boxes to children in other countries who might not otherwise receive a gift. The club provided over 80 boxes to deliver to eager

Quick Tips on Parliamentary Procedure

SUBSIDIARY MOTIONS BRIEFLY DESCRIBED BY FUNCTIONS


If an embarrassing main motion has been brought before your club, a member can propose to dispose of this question without bringing it to a direct vote, by moving to *Postpone Indefinitely*. See also Robert's Rule of Order, Newly Revised for *Objection to the Consideration of a Question*.

If a main motion might be more suitable or acceptable in an altered form, a proposal to change its wording before the main motion is voted on can be introduced by moving to *Amend*.

It may be that too much time would be required to amend the main motion properly, or that additional information is needed, so that it would be better to turn the motion over to a committee for study or redrafting before the members consider it further. Such action can be proposed by moving to Commit the main question – or *Refer* it to a committee.

If the club members prefer to consider the main motion later in the same meeting or at another meeting, this can be proposed by moving to *Postpone to a Certain Time – also called the motion to Postpone Indefinitely, or simply to postpone.*

If it is desired to continue consideration of a motion but debate is consuming too much time, a member can move to place a

limit on debate; on the other hand, if special circumstances make it advisable to permit more or longer speeches than under the usual rules, a motion to do so can be made; or, it may sometimes be desirable to combine the elements of limitations and extension, as in limit the length of speech but allowing more speeches per member. All such modifications of the normal limits of debate are proposed by means of the motion to *Limit or Extend Limits of Debate*.

If it is desired to close debate and amendment of a pending question so that it will come to an immediate vote, this can be proposed by moving the *Previous Question*.

If there is a reason to lay the main motion aside temporarily, but with the understanding that it can be taken up again whenever a majority so decides, in the same meeting or the next regular meeting, it can be proposed by the motion to *Lay on the Table*.

GFWC International President Sheila E. Shea joined other concerned leaders to urge Congress to approve the Fix NICS Act (S. 2135, H.R. 4434) at a November 29 press conference. The bipartisan legislation would direct funds to ensure that individuals convicted of domestic violence crimes are promptly and accurately added into the National Instant Criminal Background Check System. If enacted, the bill will stop convicted domestic violence offenders from purchasing firearms. Inconsistent implementation of current laws has left unacceptable gaps in the background check system and has led to tragedies such as the recent mass shooting in Sutherland Springs, Texas. The press conference was attended by Senators John Cornyn (R-Texas) and Chris Murphy (D-Connecticut) who introduced the Act, by survivors of domestic violence, and by representatives of the National Network to End Domestic Violence, the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Futures Without Violence, and the Texas Council on Family Violence.
